What is proposed?: To review the tariffs charged on the Council's off-street long stay public car

parks and on-street public parking places.

Why are the changes being introduced?: The Council has made formal proposals to vary the charges that apply on its long-stay public off-street car parks and also the charges and charging hours that apply at on-street public paid for parking places ('pay and display') in the town centre. Formal statutory consultations were carried out in January and February 2024. The purpose of this report is to consider the objection that has been received against the increase in on-street charging hours and, in the case of both proposals, decide whether to proceed as proposed.

What evidence is being used to support this Equality Impact Assessment, and how is it being used?: A qualitative assessment of the proposals and their impacts.

How will this change be implemented?: In respect of the proposed changes to the Council's long-stay off-street public car parks, following a statutory public consultation on the proposals, and if approved by the Council's Executive Committee having taken into account any objections or representations, a new legal order (known as an Off-Street Parking Places Order) will be made in respect of the relevant Council car parks in accordance with the proposals in the committee report, and thereafter the approved changes will be implemented.

In respect of the proposed changes to the affected on-street paid for parking places in the Ipswich town centre area, following a statutory public consultation on the proposals, and if approved by the Council's Executive Committee having taken into account any objections or representations, a new legal order (known as a Traffic Regulation Order) will be made in accordance with the proposals in the committee report, and thereafter the approved changes will be implemented.

In respect of on-street paid for parking bays, blue badge holders are legally entitled to free parking in all paid for parking bays and as such this will assist blue badge holders with access to the town centre for shopping.
