(SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (BOROUGH OF IPSWICH) (STOPPING, WAITING AND LOADING PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS AND ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2019) LLOYDS AVENUE, QUEEN STREET & CECIL ROAD ORDER 2025

Ipswich Borough Council ("the Council") under Sections 1, 2, 4, 45 and 46 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers, proposes to make the above Order, the effect of which will be to amend certain aspects of the Suffolk County Council (Borough of Ipswich) (Stopping, Waiting and Loading Prohibitions and Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019, as amended, by replacing revision 0 of Map Tile GJ122 with revision 1 of the same Map Tile, by replacing revision 3 of Map Tile GJ122 with revision 4 of the same Map Tile, and by replacing revision 2 of Map Tile GK122 with revision 3 of the same Map Tile. The effect of this would be to do the following within the Borough of Ipswich:

- (i) On the west side of Lloyds Avenue, reduce the length of the taxi rank to 48 metres, as measured from its northern end, and make the restriction that applies to the taxi rank one of 'No stopping except taxis on any day' (this will apply at all times);
- (ii) On the west side of Lloyds Avenue, immediately abutting the southern end of the revised taxi rank referred to in (i) above, creating a new 7 metre combined bay with a restriction of 'No stopping except taxis 10am – 5am on any day' and 'Loading only 5am – 10am on any day';
- (iii) Revoking the taxi rank on the east side of Lloyds Avenue;
- (iv) Revoking so much of the prohibition of parking at all times and the prohibition of loading at all times that applies on both sides of the section of Lloyds Avenue from its junction with Cornhill to a point 54 metres north of its junction with Cornhill and extending the existing 'Pedestrian Zone – no waiting at any time and no loading any day 11am to 4.30pm' that applies on both sides of Lloyds Avenue for a distance of 26 metres north of its junction with Cornhill so that it shall apply on both sides for a distance of 54 metres north of its junction with Cornhill instead;
- (v) Revoking 6.4 metres of the 'Resident Permit Holders Only (Z2) Mon-Sat 8am-6pm' restriction that currently applies on the east side of Cecil Road from a point 2.75 metres north of a point adjacent to the boundary of 42 and 44 Cecil Road, and replacing this with a prohibition of waiting at any time;
- (vi) confirm on the relevant map tiles changes already made by a previous order as to the charging hours (8am to 10pm daily) at the existing public paid for parking bays on Fonnereau Road (to the west of Bridle Way), Black Horse Lane, Elm Street and Museum Street; and
- (vii) reduce the length of the existing loading bay on the west side of Queen Street to 14.5 metres.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as is necessary to board or alight or to load or unload for building, industrial or demolition works; for emergency services; for the maintenance of the road or its services and to fulfil statutory duties. The usual exemptions for blue badge holders will apply.
