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Title of report: Adoption of Low Emissions Supplementary Planning Document

Report : The Low Emissions Supplementary Planning Document is a guidance document for use by developers applying for planning permission. Its purpose is to ensure that development taking place within Ipswich does not worsen air quality in Ipswich and contributes towards compliance with relevant limit values or national objectives for pollutants. It does this by setting out an approach to mitigating the effects of development on air quality. It also sets out guidance for levels of car parking provision in new developments within central Ipswich (IP-One Area) to ensure that over provision does not encourage greater car ownership and use which could adversely affect air quality.

What is proposed?: Adoption of the Low Emissions Supplementary Planning Document so that it can become a material consideration in the determination of planning applications under section 38(6) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

Why are the changes being introduced?: To ensure that the determination of planning applications by Ipswich Borough Council implements the policy requirements relating to air quality in the National Planning Policy Framework (including para. 186) and the adopted Ipswich Local Plan 2017 (Policies CS5, CS16, CS20, DM5, DM10, DM17, DM18, DM26, DM29, SP15 and

SP17). It does this by setting out guidance on measures to avoid and mitigate air quality impacts from development.

What evidence is being used to support this Equality Impact Assessment, and how is it being used?: Evidence from the EQIA of the adopted Local Plan 2017 as the policy to which the Supplementary Planning Document relates; demographic data from the Suffolk Observatory e.g. that the percentage of Ipswich population with day to day activities limited a lot in 2011 was 8% - higher than Suffolk (7.9%) but lower than England (8.3%).

How will this change be implemented?: The Supplementary Planning Document would be implemented through the determination of planning applications.

Please provide an explanation of this impact and actions to mitigate any adverse impact, or further promote positive impact.: In mitigating any air quality impacts from development, the guidance would be expected to have positive impacts, as vulnerable individuals such as children or elderly people, are at particular risk from exposure air pollution. As paragraph 1.1 of the Supplementary Planning Document states: 'Air pollution disproportionately affects the young, older people, those with underlying cardiopulmonary conditions and the most deprived within our communities.'
