Sarah Holmes is Chief Executive of The New Wolsey Theatre, Ipswich which she reopened 20 years ago along with Artistic Director Peter Rowe, placing accessibility, quality and diversity at the centre of the artistic offer and its wider work with various town communities.

She was instrumental in the setting up of We Are Ipswich in 2017 - a collective of professional creative and performance companies operating in Ipswich united to highlight the breadth of talent and opportunity working from Ipswich with local, national and international reach.

She is currently leading on 'Ramps on the Moon' an Arts Council funded project that brings together seven major mainstream UK theatre partners to respond to the opportunities and challenges of creating more employment and access for D/deaf and disabled artists, participants and audiences.

She is delighted to have become a 'citizen' of Ipswich after 20 years of investment in the town's cultural life and is proud to be involved in the development of its future.

Terry Hunt

Terry was the Editor of the East Anglian Daily Times for 21 years until retirement in 2017. He now works with many Suffolk organisations and charities. He is also a Deputy Lieutenant for Suffolk.

Terry became chair of the Ipswich Vision board in 2017, working with partners to drive the town forward.

She was also part of the now-disbanded Whitehouse Wanderers community group, which had a similar objective specifically for the Whitehouse area.

Catherine is the Vice-President of Suffolk Chamber of Commerce. The Suffolk Chamber of Commerce is one of the founding partners of the Ipswich Vision. She is the Suffolk Chamber's appointed representative on the Ipswich Vision Board.

These varied appointments provide me with the opportunity to gather real insight into Town issues and to feedback on members' views and opinions across each of these pivotal organisations in the Town. Professor Helen Langton RGN; RSCN; RCNT; RNT; BA(Hons); MSc

Helen joined the University of Suffolk in June 2018 from the University of South Wales where she was Deputy Vice-Chancellor and a Professor in Children's Cancer Nursing Education.

Helen has held a number of senior posts in universities in the UK and has a range of experience across health and social care, science, social science and education.
