## **Background**

The Board has expressed a clear wish to consider templates that contain the information that would thereafter be submitted to HM Government for each of the 11 projects.

The business cases will thereafter – if endorsed (in principle) - by the Board – be amended by the Bourgh Council (as accountable body) in the light of any Board comments and to fit with the format required by Government and then formally submitted to the Government.

First drafts of the Business Cases for the four projects below were tabled for the last Board meeting. Comments received since then have informed the second drafts.

All four projects have been the subject of informal briefings to the Board in October 2021.

#### The First 4 Business Cases

The first 4 projects to get to this stage are:

- (i) Tech Campus and Sustainable Construction Centre (Suffolk New College) (Project 19)
- (ii) Integrated Care Academy (University of Suffolk) (Project 18)
- (vi) Re-using the Old Post Office (on the Cornhill) (Project 7)
- (vii) Public Realm Improvements (Arras Square etc.) (Project 9).

The 2<sup>nd</sup> draft business case templates will be circulated separately as 'Confidential Papers' but it is anticipated that the final versions of the business cases that are submitted to HM Government will be put in the public domain (with any confidential / sensitive information - e.g. possible procurement values – redacted in an appropriate manner).

#### Links to the Town Investment Plan and the Grant Offer Letter

All four projects are consistent with Ipswich's Town Investment Plan submission from December 2020 and the Grant Offer from July 2021.

#### Recommendations to the Board

# Agenda Item 9: Communications Proposals Following Board

At the last Board meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021 the Board agreed to allocate the £1.25 million received from HM Government as a 'first instalment' of the total £25 million to three of the projects. These are listed in the table below:

It should also be noted that Ipswich Borough Council will be considering an Executive report on this matter at its meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021 – among other things – on this matter – in its role as Accountable Body.
