## What happens next?

If you do not think that you should have to pay the Penalty Charge Notice, you will need to supply the reasons, and give details. The Traffic Management Act 2004 sets out statutory grounds on which you can make a representation, with an indication of the information you should supply in support <a href="www.trafficpenaltytribunal.gov.uk/parking-england-grounds-of-appeal">www.trafficpenaltytribunal.gov.uk/parking-england-grounds-of-appeal</a>.

You can submit a representation online, or print out a hardcopy form. All representation/appeals information is available online at <a href="https://www.ipswich.gov.uk/pcnappeal">www.ipswich.gov.uk/pcnappeal</a>. If you submit online, you can also view the photographic evidence.

If the enforcement authority does not accept your representations, a Notice of Rejection will be sent to you which will give you a further period of 28 days either to pay the penalty charge, or to appeal against the decision to the Independent Adjudicator. Information on appealing further to the Independent Adjudicator will be included at the end of the rejection letter.
